REPRESENTATIVE MATTERS

Valmarc Corporation v. Nike Inc. & Converse, Inc. (D. Or.)

Counsel for plaintiff Valmarc Corporation in a suit alleging that Nike and Converse misappropriated Valmarc's trade secret anti-counterfeiting technology. Wright Medical Technology, Inc. v. Paragon 28, Inc. (D. Colo.)

Counsel for plaintiff Wright Medical in a suit alleging that Paragon 28 infringed Wright's patents and misappropriated Wright's trade secrets related to its foot and ankle medical products. In November 2022, Paragon agreed to pay Wright Medical \$26 million to settle the case and other pending claims.

Korea Advanced Institute of Science and Technology v. Paulina et al. (E.D. Wis.)

Counsel for defendant Paulina against a Korean research university alleging tortious interference and unjust enrichment related to patent litigation financing contracts. After briefing, the court granted Paulina's motion to dismiss with prejudice, tossing out all claims against Paulina. Confidential Commercial Arbitration (AAA)

Trial counsel for financial firm in a breach of contract dispute relating to a \$250 million patent infringement judgment against a prominent electronics company.

Confidential Employment Arbitration (AAA)

Lead trial counsel for one of the world's largest financial firms against former employee alleging retaliatory discharge.

Align v. 3Shape (D. Del.)

Counsel for Align in a patent infringement suit brought by 3Shape related to the technology in Align's intraoral scanners. After one of 3Shape's patents was dismissed from the case in 2020 and a second 3Shape patent was held unpatentable in an IPR, the parties entered a global settlement in early 2022.

Meso Scale Diagnostics, LLC v. Roche Diagnostics Corporation (D. Del.)

Represented Meso Scale Diagnostics in a six-day jury trial against Roche Diagnostics for infringing patents related to electrochemiluminescence (ECL) technology. After less than two hours of deliberation, the jury returned a \$137.25 million verdict in favor of Meso Scale and found that Roche had willfully infringed all of the asserted patents.
